Date:	May 31 st – June 5th
Student Age Group	13- 18 year olds
Mission Description	It's a week of incredible fun and service. Join over 200 other teenagers serving lunch and planning activities for kids in under-resourced communities all over Atlanta. Mission: Atlanta is an experience that will help students realize their leadership gifts through serving others.
Accommodations	Students will be staying at YMCA's in Alpharetta and Forsyth County.
Meals	Students will be preparing and eating meals each day at SHO. Some days may require a sack lunch.
Cost	\$175 per student. Students register directly on-line with the YMCA.
Transportation	Transportation to YMCA at the beginning and end of the trip is the responsibility of the student. Transportation during the project is provided by the YMCA.
A Typical Day	Students will be serving each day in under-resourced communities in Atlanta. Each evening will be spent building the strength of the team through excursions all over Atlanta. Two nights will be spent in leadership development for the team.

Student Age Group	Students entering Grades 9-12
Mission Description	SafeHouse Outreach touches the lives of those who reside outside the main body of society -those who live in the margins. Our passion is helping people that are often overlooked and have nowhere else to turn. The mission of SHO is to provide practical, emotional, and physical assistance to those living in the margins and help integrate them back into society. Students will be participating in daily work projects, city prayer walks, working with the homeless, and much more.
Accommodations	Students will be staying in dormitories located at SHO. SHO is located in downtown ATL.
Meals	Students will be preparing and eating meals each day at SHO. Some days may require a sack lunch.
Cost	\$250 per student. 25 % of the trip is due at time of application. The remaining of the balance is due one month prior to the event.
Transportation	Transportation to SHO at the beginning and end of the trip is the responsibility of the student. Transportation during the project is provided by flood and SHO.

Student Age Group	Students entering Grades 9-12
Mission Description	Whirlwind Mission serves the International Village in Metro Atlanta and is home to 145 different countries and 761 language groups! WWM ministers to people from Asia, Africa, Europe and Latin America. Most of our community is either Buddhist, Muslim, Hindu or Catholic. This is foreign missions in our own back yard! The majority of the children in our area speak English. Our mission is to “reach the lost with the Gospel of Jesus Christ by meeting real needs in the community through developing relationships with the people living in the community.” Students will be working on work projects and leading bible-based activities with children living in these communities.
Accommodations	Students will be staying at a local church located closely to areas in which we will be serving and working.
Meals	Students will be preparing and eating meals each day at the church. Some days may require a sack lunch.
Cost	\$200 per student. 25 % of the trip is due at time of application. The remaining of the balance is due one month prior to the event.
